Indigenous women in the Americas suffer extreme and disparate levels of gender-based violence. An international panel of indigenous women from Brazil, Guatemala, Peru, and the United States will discuss the need for long-term sustained action in their respective regions and countries to address violence against indigenous women and related deep-rooted issues that intensify such violence, including violations of indigenous peoples' rights to their lands and resources and right of self-government, poverty, climate change, environmental degradation, and other human rights violations.
